DOGS DIE IN HOT CARS - PLEASE READ ME

Dogs in Cars on Hot Days. Your dog is vulnerable at at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offer the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts when travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.

The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.

Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.

When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT

LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put the dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

Proviso. For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud
 Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will
 not be considered to be beaten dogs.

13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has
 elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have
 been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only
 with special permission of the Show Management.
14. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General
 Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press
 wherever possible.
15. Exclusion of Dogs. The Show Management may exclude or remove any dog which, in their
 opinion or that of the Judge, is not in a fit state for exhibition.
16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete
 number before entry to the show / event can be made. All overseas entries without an
 Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor / competitor.

18. Fouling. Exhibitors are reminded of new Kennel Club Regulation F9 which requires removal
 as soon as possible of any fouling caused by their dogs at this Show and in the environs of
 the Showground. Exercise Area must be adhered to.
19. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F. Regulation for the Preparation
 of Dogs for Exhibition.

- OPEN:** For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.
- VETERAN:** For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 9.00 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 10.00 a.m for Bitches, 10.30 a.m for Dogs.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. Entry fees: First entry - Members £12.00, Non-members £15.00. Subsequent entries with the same dog £2.00. Veteran Class £4.00
7. Prize Money: There will be no prize money at this Show.
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition. Puppies over four calendar months of age on the first day of the show can be entered NFC if provided by the Show Management.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
11. Best Puppy in Show. Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled, the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best In Show is a puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy In Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best In Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog, it will also automatically be Best Puppy In Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow selection of Best in Show. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy. Withdrawal from other Competition. Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Proviso. For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
12. Best in Show. The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. Withdrawal from other Competition. Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition prior to the competition for Best in Show. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

AN INTRODUCTION TO YOUR JUDGES

Mrs Ann Arch - Dogs

I have showed dogs for over 60 years, starting with Cairn Terriers, then OES, Shih Tzu, Komondor & Pulis, My first husband had an "Alsation", the second a Border Collie. I have served on local Canine Societies from my teens, then onto the Committee of National OES and National Working Breeds, and Secretary of the latter for the past 36 years.

In showing/breeding I can account for UK, USA, Australian and International Champion stock in OES. The Komondor was the only Group Winner in the UK (known to so many as "Kitten"). I owned/breed my first Group/BIS winning puli, a line which my daughter (now resident in US) continues to this day, her latest notable success, she took Group 4 at Crufts 2007.

Way back in 1960, I was often benched next to Fred Curnow, in those days we had benching at Open as well as Championship Shows! When we'd shown in NSC, we often sat on the bench and talked, and so I became interested in Dobermanns that far back! I awarded my first Dobermann cc's at Richmond in 1983, but then numbers increased so much that the next 9 shows I judged only one sex. My last appointment was Blackpool in 2002

Mr Spencer Houghton - Bitches

My first real encounter with a Dobermann came in the summer of 1982 at the city show in Southampton. My wife, Sue and I had decided we would like to get a dog and we had heard there was a dog show being locally.

We went along to see what types of dogs we liked, I had always lived with family dogs but this was a new experience for Sue. Having trawled round the show with all these different dogs we kept coming back to the same ring, the Dobermann. There we met someone who was to become a life long friend and kennel partner, Angela O'Callaghan.

Our mind was made up and after several months of going to shows and talking to many people around the rings we got our first Dobermann in the spring of 1983 – Crossridge the Jazzy Gent from Margaret Detheridge and John Crossley. Although his litter brother went onto become a champion, our William was more of a fighter than a shower and we retired him from the ring.

Shortly afterwards our new friend Angela bred her bitch to Williams brother CH Crossridge the Jazzman and Sue and I helped with the birth and rearing of the litter and were now absolutely hooked. Between Angel (Crislea) and ourselves (Desuzer) we bread a number of litters, always keeping one for the ring and for breeding and eventually we decided to join together as a partnership under Angela's affix.

In the late 1980's we joined the Birmingham & District Dobermann Club and both Sue and I were invited to become committee members and later I was vice chairman and show manager. Although successful on the open show circuit and numerous minor wins at championship show level our real breakthrough came with the home bred CH Crislea On Target who won 3 CCs and XRCCs. Ford was an absolute delight both in the ring and at home – a view shared by many who used him a stud.

Sadly the loss of Ford knocked the stuffing out of Sue and I and although we did return to the ring both with Dobermanns and our other breed Border Terriers, the magic that was Ford was not there and we decided to call an end to the showing but have always kept in touch with our friends and regular attendees at the shows to keep an eye on our beloved Dobermann.

We still have an 11 year old Dobermann who is a cantankerous old girl but we love her!

THE WEKANBY TROPHY

Presented by Stan & Wendy Kingsbury for the Dobermann gaining the most points in Obedience Classes based on the following system: Each year comm.. Sept 1st.

Special Pre Pre Beginners:	1 st - 3pts,	2 nd - 2pts,	3 rd - 1pts
Special Pre Beginners:	1 st - 3pts,	2 nd - 2pts,	3 rd - 1pts
Special Beginners:	1 st - 3pts,	2 nd - 2pts,	3 rd - 1pts
Special Novice:	1 st - 3pts,	2 nd - 2pts,	3 rd - 1pts
Special Test A:	1 st - 3pts,	2 nd - 2pts,	3 rd - 1pts

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following Definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Show awards issued by the Irish Kennel Club which count towards the title of Champion, shall be five point Green Stars or more.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a Member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e 27 September 2008.

Wins in Variety Classes do not count for entry in breed Classes, but when entering for Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety Classes must be counted. A Variety Class is one in which more than one Breed or a variety of a breed can compete. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) Withdrawal:

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9 (j) and 20.

2) Transfer:

(a) if a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

(b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height or in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

(c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight and height.

(d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING: For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

UNDERGRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not.

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won seven or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOG FOR EXHIBITION

F (Annex B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
2.
 - a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
 - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or any other part of a dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee;
 - (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed;
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for a further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damaged caused.
