22. Where classes are divided, competitors entered therein shall be notified of all changes and timed stay exercises must not be held earlier than advertised for the original class.
23. Where timed stays will take place it must be announced in the Schedule that they will take priority over other tests. The times of such tests to be published at the Show and in the Catalogue. Timed stays must not commence before one hour after the published time for the commencement of judging.
24. For the duration of the Show, and including those in the exercise area, all dogs must be on a lead except when competing or practising prior to the competition.
25. No dog shall be allowed in the judging ring other than those competing in the class being judged.
26. Nothing may be carried, worn or displayed by a handler or a dog during judging which is capable of indicating the identity of the dog or owner nor must anything be said or any action taken which identifies the dog other than by exhibit number.
27. Any dog which is not presented for stay or scent exercises when called for testing will be considered to have withdrawn from the class.
28. After the commencement of judging the responsibility for dogs being brought to the ring to compete is entirely the competitors.
29. Food shall not be carried or given to a dog under test.
30. All offers of sponsorship or donation must be included with the name of the sponsors.
31. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
32. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their full details recorded on the entry form.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

1. Dogs are ineligible to compete at Limited Shows which have won an Obedience Certificate or obtained any award that counts towards the title of Obedience Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Obedience Champions are only eligible to compete in Class C at Open and Championship Shows.
2. A dog must be entered in the lowest schedule class for which it is eligible and may also be entered in another class if desired, one special class excepted.
3. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class, that date being 16th January 2010.
4. Societies may schedule classes other than those defined by the Kennel Club. The eligibility for "Special" classes must be defined by the Society and included in the schedule. The word "Special" must be included in the title of the class.

An Introduction to your Breed Judge, Mr R Oldham

His first Chow Anna Wong of Wang Li (born 1965) was purchased with the showing in mind and soon after the TOWMENA affix was registered. Early showing from his family home in Sussex was mostly via British Rail since he was too young to obtain a driving licence. This nearly always involved trips across London on the underground and the Chows having to be carried up and down escalators, with many a tale to tell!

Involvement at that time was all about trying to breed something better and judging was never thought about. A lot of stewarding was carried out and contact with other breeds meant access to endless information and experience to be gained.

Notable records include: First Champion made up in 1974, first CCs awarded in 1976, bred & campaigned Chow Bitch CC record holder T Impudent Miss (40 CCs), imported as a puppy Ch Fort Knox Here's The Tiger at Towmena who won 20+ CCs but more importantly became a dominant sire, including topping the Utility Group, and will be found in a goodly number of modern day pedigrees around the world. Stepped back from regular breeding/exhibiting in 1992 following divorce but there have been nearly as many comebacks as Sinatra to make up a further three Champions plus, at the time of writing, the 2006 born Ch T In the Frame with 19CCs & 6 res CCs. He also achieved Rods first ever BIS at an all breeds Championship Show last summer at SWKA and along the way has notched up a RBIS, 7 Groups plus numerous other placings. Just two Chows reside at Towmena now due to judging commitments etc.

Other breeds have been kept/bred including Pekingese, Airedale Terriers, Griffons, Lakeland Terrier and have also lived alongside such other breeds as Labradors, Bouvier des Flandres and Tibetan Terriers and a Champion made up in the latter. All very useful experiences enabling a more rounded view of dogs in general.

Served on breed club and general society committees and originally proposed and help set up both the Hip Scoring and the Chow Judges training schemes. President of the National Chow Chow Club.

Currently approved to award CCs in 20 Breeds plus the Utility and Pastoral Groups. Milestone judging appointments for Chows have included COTY in 1979 and 1990, Dogs at the Chow Chow Club Centenary in 1995, Crufts 1998, BUBA in 1984 and 2000. The breed has also been judged many times overseas including Australia & NZ plus Specialities in USA.

4. a) The Show will open at 10.30am
b) Judging will commence at 11.00 AM
 5. a) In classes without a full running order dogs will be received until one hour after the commencement of judging (12.00 noon) after which no dogs may be received except under unforeseen and exceptional circumstances and by special permission of the Show Management
b) Where dogs are entered solely in classes with a full running order they will be received at any time. It is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
 6. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed
 7. First entry per dog - Members £4.00; subsequent entries £1.50, First entry per dog - Non-members £4.50; subsequent entries £1.50. Catalogues: £1.50 (please order with entries) £2.00 on the door.
 8. Prize Money: No Prize money will be paid at this show.
 9. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
 10. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
 11. Animals allows in Event
No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee.
However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
 12. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for competition at Kennel Club Licensed Obedience Shows.
 13. The mating of Bitches within the precincts of the Show is strictly forbidden.
 14. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
 15. A dog shall be disqualified and removed from the Show if it is:-
 - a) A Bitch which is in season
 - b) Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
 - c) Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d) Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
 16. After a dog has commenced competing in a Class, no substitution of handler is permitted in that Class.
 17. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
 18. Shall a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
 19. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge or Judges.
 20. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
 21. The maximum number of entries allowed in any class is 60. If the entry received exceeds 60, except for Championship Class C, the class shall be equally divided (to within one dog) by a draw. If the resulting individual class entry, after decision, exceeds 60 a further division of the total class entry shall take place so that each equal division of the class is 60 or less. In all classes, other than Championship Class C, if the entry received exceeds 50 a further division of the total entry may take place so that each equal division of the class is 50 or less. Prize money for each division (which must be judged separately) shall be the same as that offered for the

DEFINITION OF ELIGIBILITY FOR OBEDIENCE CLASSES

A dog may be entered in any two of the following classes for which it is eligible:

A dog may be entered in any two of the following classes for which it is eligible:

SPECIAL PRE PRE BEGINNERS: For **Owner, Handler or Dog** that have never won a first prize in any Obedience Class. Test will consist of Heel on Lead, recall to front (no finish) (Extra commands will not be penalised except in the Stays.) 1/2 minute sit-stay, 1 minute down-stay. ALL WORK MAY BE DONE ON LEAD.

SPECIAL PRE BEGINNERS: For **Dogs** that have not won more than 3 first prizes in any Obedience Classes. Test will consist of Heel on Lead, Heel free, recall to front with finish to heel. (Extra commands will not be penalised except in Stays). 1 minute sit-stay, 2 minutes down-stay, both with handler in sight.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS: For **Dogs** that have not won more than 4 first prizes in Beginners Classes. Test will consist of Heel on Lead, Heel free, recall to front with finish to heel. Retrieve any article (*no finish*), (Extra commands will not be penalised). 1 minute sit-stay, 2 minutes down-stay, both with handler in sight. (Extra commands to be penalised)

SPECIAL NOVICE: For **Dogs** that have not won more than 6 first prizes in this class. Test will consist of Heel on Lead *to include one left about turn and extra commands to be penalised*, Heel free (as Heel on Lead), 'A' type recall (Extra commands will not be penalised). Retrieve a dumb-bell, temperament test (Dog to be standing and on the lead), 1minute sit-stay, 2 minutes down-stay, both with handler in sight. back to dogs. (Extra commands will be penalised.)

SPECIAL TEST A: This class is open to all. Test will consist of Heel free (Extra commands will not be penalised). Retrieve Judges article. 'A' Type recall, (no extra commands) 2 minute sit-stay, 5 minute down-stay, both with handler out of sight. (Extra commands will be penalised). Scent (handler scent on judge's scent cloths with no decoys. Extra commands over article to be penalised.)

OBEDIENCE RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Obedience Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B.
2. Entry is limited to Dobermanns.
3. Dogs which have won an Obedience Certificate or obtained any award that counts towards the title of Obedience Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following Definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Show awards issued by the Irish Kennel Club which count towards the title of Champion, shall be five point Green Stars or more.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a Member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e 16th January 2010.

Wins in Variety Classes do not count for entry in breed Classes, but when entering for Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety Classes must be counted. A Variety Class is one in which more than one Breed or a variety of a breed can compete. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

- 1) Withdrawal: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9 (j) and 20.
- 2) Transfer:
 - (a) if a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - (b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height or in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - (c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight and height.
 - (d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY:	For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
PUPPY:	For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
JUNIOR:	For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
YEARLING:	For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
NOVICE:	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Show (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).
GRADUATE:	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not.
POSTGRADUATE:	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not.
LIMIT:	For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won seven or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
OPEN:	For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.
VETERAN:	For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

NFC: Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

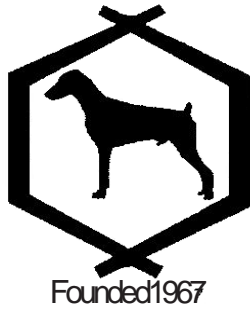
RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 10.30 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 11.00 am for breed and obedience.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. Entry fees: First entry - Members first entry per dog £4.00, subsequent entries with same dog £1.50, Non-members first entry per dog £4.50, subsequent entries with the same dog £1.50. Veteran Class £1.50 per entry. Not for Competition £1.00 per dog.
7. Prize Money - No Prize Money will be paid at this show.
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition. Puppies over 4 months but under 6 months on the first day of the show may enter Not for Competition.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
11. Best Puppy in Show. Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled, the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best In Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog, it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow selection of Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy. Withdrawal from other Competition. Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Proviso. For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
12. Best in Show. The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. Withdrawal from other Competition. Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition prior to the competition for Best in Show. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Proviso. For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in

13. competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with special permission of the Show Management.
14. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
15. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F. Regulation for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show / event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor / competitor.
17. Exclusion of Dogs. The Show Management may exclude or remove any dog which, in their opinion or that of the Judge, is not in a fit state for exhibition.
18. Fouling. Exhibitors are reminded of new Kennel Club Regulation F9 which requires removal as soon as possible of any fouling caused by their dogs at this Show and in the environs of the Showground. Exercise Area must be adhered to.
19. Dogs in Cars on Hot days. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dogs welfare.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOG FOR EXHIBITION

F (Annex B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
2.
 - a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
 - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or any other part of a dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee;
 - (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed;
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for a further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm.

Please take care of your dog.

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage cause
